

The goal of this unique project was to create an “up north” cabin in the basement of the homeowner’s existing residence. The design requirements for the project included a large entertainment area/media space, bar and kitchen, and a game area with a full shuffle board table. Other design elements included a workout room, a locker room for outdoor equipment, and a bathroom with built-in lockers. All of the spaces were designed with the outdoor motif to carry the theme from the entertainment space throughout the entire project.

In order to achieve the “up north” feel, the design called for large pine and hardwood trees to be stripped of their bark and installed at key points throughout the design. We also had half logs installed as false beams on the ceiling. The walls were made to look like a log cabin by using half logs between the tree trunks. The stone fire place was incorporated with built-in cabinetry on both sides under the arches. A large fly-tying bench was located next to the large media area and was built out of cabinets to match the overall look of the basement. The bar and kitchenette were framed by two large tree trunks and the bar top was made from a tree cut vertically into a large flat 3” thick slab.
